



Construction Update: Steveston Interchange Project

Site preparations for upcoming construction

November 2022

As part of the Province of B.C.'s Steveston Interchange Project, which will expand the interchange from two to five lanes, crews are preparing the area for the new interchange construction.

Starting on November 3 and lasting for approximately three months, crews will remove trees, vegetation, and topsoil within the vicinity of the Steveston Interchange, including the northbound onramp onto Highway 99, in advance of upcoming utility relocation work. This is necessary to accommodate the footprint of the larger interchange and to clear the area for construction. Trees removed as part of the project are on Ministry and City of Richmond lands. Tree removals will begin on Ministry land and then move to City of Richmond land at a later date. Larger trees and shrubs that are removed will be replaced.

Crews will also build access roads into the construction area at the same time. This work involves bringing crushed rock to the area and compacting it with large construction equipment.

Work will be conducted during the day and night. Major traffic impacts are not anticipated, and noise will be minimal. There will be minor disruptions to pedestrians along Steveston Highway when tree removals are happening. Access for emergency responders, residents and businesses will be maintained throughout construction.

	<p>Timing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Starting November 3 for approximately 3 months. 		<p>Hours of Work</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Daytime from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. > Nighttime from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.
	<p>Traffic</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Flaggers and notification signs will be in place to direct pedestrians on sidewalk. 		<p>Impacts/Interruptions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Noise impacts will be minimal and similar to existing traffic noise levels. > Local residents may notice an increase in construction vehicles. > Minor traffic delays on Highway 99 and Steveston Highway at night. > Single lane alternating traffic on Steveston Highway will be implemented at night. > Small disruptions to pedestrian traffic when the tree removals are happening along Steveston Highway.
