





Construction Update: Steveston Interchange Project

Daytime Pile Driving

June 2023

Note: This <u>notice from April 2023</u> includes this work and we have an update to share.



As part of the Province of B.C.'s Steveston Interchange Project, which will expand the interchange from two to five lanes, crews will begin pile driving as part of the construction of the new overpass foundations.

Beginning the week of June 26, pile driving will take place in the northwest and northeast quadrants of the Steveston Interchange Project for a period of approximately four to six weeks.

Pile driving will start in the northwest quadrant and move to the northeast quadrant. There will be an overnight short-term closure of Highway 99 when the pile driving crane moves from the northwest quadrant to the northeast quadrant. Before the closure, a notification with further details will be provided.

Pile driving will only take place during the day. Nearby residents and pedestrians will hear noise during pile driving. Vibration may also be felt in the immediate area where work is taking place. For added safety, there will be intermittent stoppages for pedestrians crossing the Steveston Highway overpass sidewalk.



The new Steveston Interchange is part of the George Massey Tunnel replacement. Opening in 2025, the modernized interchange will improve traffic flow, enhance transit operations, and include sidewalks and cycling lanes on both sides of the structure for the first time.

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
