



Project Update: December 2023

Transit and Cycling Improvements Projects Are Complete

The Highway 99 Tunnel Program celebrated an exciting milestone on Thursday, November 23, with the completion of bus-on-shoulder lanes in Delta. Bus trips will now be quicker and more reliable for transit riders travelling along the corridor.

This was the third Transit and Cycling Improvement Project delivered ahead of the new eight-lane, toll free tunnel to replace the existing George Massey Tunnel. Each project helps to relieve congestion and improve transit and cycling options along Highway 99 between Richmond and Delta.

Highway 99 Bus-on-Shoulder Lanes




We added bus-on-shoulder lanes along Highway 99 in Delta. Upgrades include:

- Creating a southbound bus-on-shoulder lane between Highway 17A and Ladner Trunk Road.
- Extending the northbound bus-on-shoulder lane between Ladner Trunk Road and 80th Street to tie into the existing bus-on-shoulder lane.

Transit users will benefit from the new lanes as they are put into service over the next few weeks.

Bridgeport Road Bus Connection

We completed upgrades for bus users, pedestrians, and cyclists, including:

• A new bus-only lane that makes public transit faster and more reliable for people traveling from Bridgeport Road to Highway 99.





- A safer signalized intersection on Sea Island Way that prioritizes buses and protects pedestrians and cyclists when they're crossing the road.
- A new multi-use pathway near Highway 99 and Patterson Road that gives people more options for biking and walking.

Highway 99 and 17A Off-Ramp Widening



A newly built cycling shelter for people using the bike shuttle to cross the Fraser River.

We completed upgrades for drivers and cyclists that use Highway 99 and the 17A offramp, including:

- Extending and widening the northbound Highway 99 off-ramp to Highway 17A which will improve traffic flow and reduce congestion.
- Upgrading the George Massey Tunnel bike shuttle stop south of the river, so cycling is safer, easier and more accessible.

About the Program

We are also delivering two other projects as part of the overall Highway 99 Tunnel Program. Construction is currently underway on the Steveston Interchange Project, and the Fraser River Tunnel Project has entered the procurement phase.
