

Project Update: September 2024

Highway 99 Southbound Lane Improvements



August 2024: Work along Highway 99 in Richmond begins.

As part of the Highway 99 Tunnel Program focused on improving travel along the Highway 99 corridor, sand preloading is underway in Richmond between Blundell Road and Steveston Highway to increase southbound capacity on Highway 99. Once the new eight-lane tunnel is complete, Highway 99 will have three general purpose lanes and a dedicated transit lane in each direction from Westminster Highway in Richmond to Ladner Trunk Road in Delta.

The Steveston Interchange Project took a big step forward this summer. The north half of the new structure will be complete this fall with crews finishing the traffic deck and roadway approaches. Once the north half is complete, work will begin on the south half of the new structure.

By the end of 2025, the new interchange will be complete with five vehicle lanes and transit-priority features to keep vehicles and buses moving. It will also have pedestrian and cycling lanes on both sides of the overpass for the first time.

Community Engagement

The Highway 99 Tunnel Program team has had a busy spring and summer. In addition to advancing the new tunnel's design and selecting a design-builder, the team made appearances at a dozen community events to share information and answer questions.

Locations were chosen to reach a cross-section of people who use the tunnel, along with those who use trails and parks nearby. For example, the team popped up at Bridgeport SkyTrain Station, the George Massey Tunnel bike shuttle and Tsawwassen Mills mall.

In total, the team spoke to more than 1,900 people in the past several months to share information and hear about the things that matter to people who use the tunnel and live in the area.
