





Steveston Interchange Project Overnight Highway 99 Detour on May 6, 7, and 8

May 2025

UPDATED May 5: The Highway 99 overnight detour originally scheduled for May 6 has been extended to include the nights of May 7 and 8.



Highway 99 northbound and southbound will be closed to traffic overnight between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. on May 6, 7, and 8.

The closure is needed to ensure crews can safely move a crane across Highway 99. In addition to the crane crossing, crews will be working on electrical connections for the George Massey Tunnel counterflow system.

Vehicles will be detoured utilizing the on- and off-ramps along Steveston Highway. The work is being completed overnight to minimize traffic disruptions.

The new five-lane Steveston Interchange Project is a key part of the Highway 99 Tunnel Program to improve travel along the Highway 99 corridor. As part of the broader Program, the interchange will integrate seamlessly with the new eight-lane, immersed tube tunnel being built under the Fraser River to replace the George Massey Tunnel.

As is currently the case, the Steveston Highway northbound loop ramp onto Highway 99 will remain closed, with traffic rerouted to access the north side on-ramp via left turn lanes.

East-west travel on Steveston Highway will be maintained for vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists. Existing transit stops will be maintained in all directions.
