





Steveston Interchange Project Southbound Highway 99 On-Ramp Detour for Roadworks

October 2025



Beginning as early as October 6 and continuing for approximately three weeks,

crews will be reconstructing the existing southbound on-ramp. To safely accommodate these improvements, the southbound lane will be closed.

While this work is underway, traffic will be temporarily detoured via the designated transit on-ramp to access Highway 99 southbound from Steveston Highway. Signage will direct traffic safely through the detour.

Work is scheduled to take place during daytime and nighttime hours.

Drivers should anticipate delays, especially during peak travel times and consider using alternate routes.

To minimize impacts on bus service, the Highway 99 southbound bus lane will be reopened prior to the start of this construction work. Bus stops will also be temporarily relocated on Steveston Highway and Highway 99.

The new five-lane Steveston Interchange Project is a key part of the Highway 99 Tunnel Program to improve travel along the Highway 99 corridor. As part of the broader Program, the interchange will integrate seamlessly with the new eight-lane, immersed tube tunnel being built under the Fraser River to replace the George Massey Tunnel.

Timing

- Traffic detour in place utilizing the southbound transit on-ramp



Impacts/Interruptions

- > Relocated bus stops
- Expect delays
- Moderate noise from construction equipment
- > Pedestrian sidewalk will be rerouted. Signage will be posted.
