

Steveston Interchange Project

POSTPONED: New Highway 99 Southbound Off-Ramp Signal

November 2025

Updated November 13, 2025: The below-noted work has been postponed until further notice. The southbound off-ramp traffic configuration will remain unchanged in the interim.

As work progresses toward completion of the new five-lane Steveston Interchange Project, a new traffic pattern change will be implemented on the southbound Highway 99 off-ramp.



Beginning **as early as November 13**, a second dedicated right-turn lane onto Steveston Highway westbound will be introduced. This new dual right-turn traffic pattern will be controlled by a traffic signal.

This change will improve traffic flow and increase safety for drivers and pedestrians at the west intersection.

The new five-lane Steveston Interchange Project is a key part of the Highway 99 Tunnel Program to improve travel along the Highway 99 corridor. As part of the broader Program, the interchange will integrate seamlessly with the new eight-lane, immersed tube tunnel being built under the Fraser River to replace the George Massey Tunnel.
