



Fraser River Tunnel Project: Work Along Highway 99 Corridor

As part of ongoing preparations for construction of the new toll-free, eight-lane tunnel to replace the existing George Massey Tunnel, crews will conduct daytime and nighttime work along the Highway 99 corridor.

Day and Nighttime Work along Highway 99 in Richmond and Delta

Starting the week of January 5 and continuing until early February, crews will conduct geotechnical and pavement investigations along Highway 99. Work will occur between Blundell Road and the tunnel portal in Richmond, and between Highway 17 and the tunnel portal in Delta.

- Daytime work:
 - **January 7 to 14:** 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. – one lane of traffic will move at a reduced speed (60 km/h) as a vehicle conducts survey work. All other lanes will be unaffected.
- Nighttime work:
 - **January 5 to 8:** 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. – single lane closures will be in effect.
 - **January 7 to 16:** 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. – one lane of traffic will move at a reduced speed (20-30 km/h) and experience brief stoppages as a vehicle conducts survey work. All other lanes will be unaffected.
 - **January 15 to February 5:** 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. (northbound) or 6 a.m. (southbound) or 7 a.m. (weekends) – single lane-closures will be in effect.
- Travel in both directions will be maintained at all times.
- Signs will be posted and traffic-control personnel will be on site.
