



Fraser River Tunnel Project: Temporary Safety Closure of Millennium Trail


Temporary Millennium Trail Closure: Starting in Early February

As part of construction for the new toll-free, eight-lane tunnel, crews will begin tree clearing and relocating utilities in the area shown in purple in the map below.

To ensure public safety, the section of Millennium Trail identified by the yellow line will be closed starting February 5 for up to one month. Detours will not be available during this time.

- Temporary fencing will be installed, restricting public access to the portion of Millennium Trail identified below.
- Signs will be placed to clearly identify closure limits.

We apologize for the inconvenience. As this will be an active construction zone, the trail closure is necessary to ensure public safety, which is a top priority for the Project.



What to Expect During Tree Clearing near Millennium Trail
