### Choose the Information You Would Like to Receive

In December 2025, the Steveston Interchange Project reached a major milestone when it opened all lanes to vehicle traffic. With only minor roadwork and landscaping remaining on the interchange, and early construction work quickly ramping up on the Fraser River Tunnel Project (FRTTP) we are refocusing our email-based public outreach.

With the Fraser River Tunnel Project (FRTTP) moving into construction, we have restructured our Highway 99 Tunnel Program mailing lists to allow subscribers to choose the type and amount of FRTTP information you would like to receive.

When you visit our e-notifications [webpage](#), you will now have the option to sign up for general project updates as the new toll-free, eight-lane tunnel progresses.

With work underway in multiple areas, we recognize subscribers have different levels of interest in day-to-day activities and potential public impacts. That is why we are now offering a way to receive targeted construction notices related to four specific areas: Richmond, Delta, Deas Island and marine. You can sign up to receive construction notices from one, some or all of those areas. **If you have already selected any of these options when signing up online or through one of our paper forms, please disregard this message—you do not need to sign up again.**

Current subscribers to the Highway 99 Program general newsletter will automatically continue to receive it, but will need to sign up for area-specific construction notices if they wish to receive those.
