

Fraser River Tunnel Project

Highway 99 – Overnight Single Lane in Each Direction and Five-Minute Stoppage

April 2026

Updated April 24, 2026:

As part of early construction works for the new toll-free, eight-lane tunnel to replace the existing George Massey Tunnel, traffic on Highway 99 will be reduced to a single lane in each direction early on the morning of Wednesday, April 29. This reduction will occur at the approach areas. During this time, there will also be a brief, five-minute traffic stoppage in both directions.





To minimize traffic impacts, this work will take place overnight. Drivers are asked to follow signage and directions from traffic-control personnel.
