

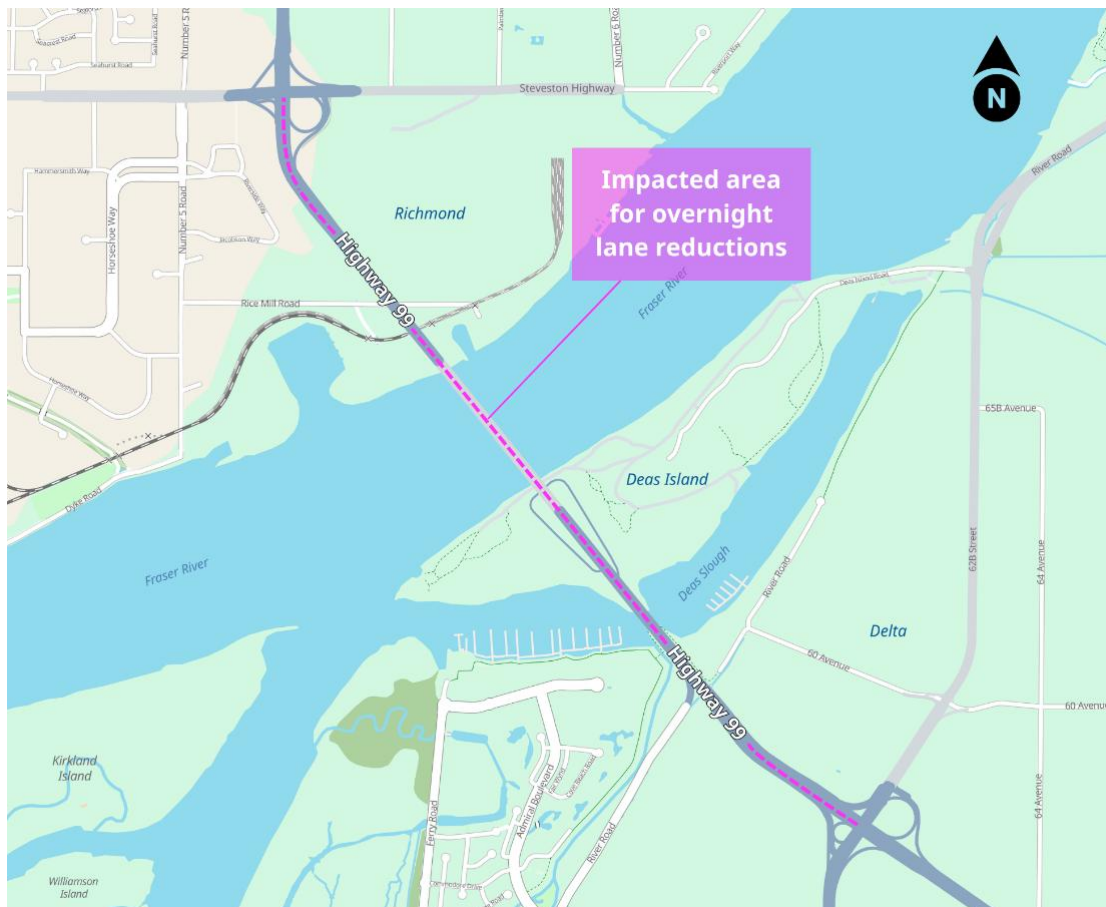
Fraser River Tunnel Project

Highway 99 – Intermittent overnight lane reductions for equipment installation

July 2026

As part of ongoing preparations for construction of the new toll-free, eight-lane tunnel to replace the existing George Massey Tunnel, overnight, single-lane reductions are needed intermittently along Highway 99 between Steveston Highway and Highway 17A. **Lane reductions will begin as early as July 12 and continue for approximately three weeks to allow crews to install instrumentation and monitoring equipment.**

Travel in both directions will be maintained at all times. Drivers are asked to follow signage and directions from traffic-control personnel. Normal traffic patterns will be restored prior to counter-flow going into effect for the morning commute.
