

Fraser River Tunnel Project

Intermittent overnight lane reductions for access roads construction

Late July to December 2026

Updated July 27, 2026

As part of ongoing preparations for construction of the new toll-free, eight-lane tunnel to replace the existing George Massey Tunnel, intermittent overnight single-lane reductions will be in place at the locations noted below from late July until December 2026. This work will support the creation of access and egress roads to construction sites, helping ensure the safe and efficient movement of materials while reducing traffic in more congested areas.



Travel in both directions will be maintained at all times. Drivers are asked to follow signage and directions from traffic-control personnel.
